Branch News

Last Meeting Saturday 12th November Wills and Probate Brooke Wescott

Our speaker showed us a portrait of his ancestor Brooke Foss Westcott (1825-1901), after who he had been named. He told us that this man had been a teacher at Harrow School and then had gone into the church. At his death in 1901 he was Bishop of Durham and left £54,640 in his will. He said this had got him interested in Family History and he showed how he had traced this line back through time by Wills and Probate.

He explained that only Spinsters and Widows could make a will until the Married Women's Property Act came into force and that a lot of documents were written in Latin until the 1750s, when they started to be in English, though Inventories tended to be in English before this date.

He told of two generations, a father and son both called George Foss, both died at sea and were both ships Captains and sailed from England to India and back, a two year round trip with the crew only being paid when they got back to England, only George Senior having made a will.

Another ancestor Foss Westcott, whose wife's maiden name was Brooke, had served with Clive of India.

The names Brooke and Foss had come down the family line and he had passed them on to his sons, one having Foss and the other Brooke in their names. By Joan Secker Wlodarczyk.
