


Branch News

Free public talk and workshop at Manchester Central Library, in association with Manchester and Lancashire Family History Society

In 1815, just over two hundred years ago, Sir Humphry Davy invented a miners' safety lamp that would revolutionise industry in Britain, Europe and beyond. The

safety lamp was a source of controversy, however: others laid claim to having invented it, and a bitter public dispute ensued. In this talk, Professor Sharon Ruston (Lancaster University) will explore some of Davy's private letters, the majority of which will be published for the very first time in 2018. After the talk there will be a more informal workshop, run by Dr Andrew Lacey (Lancaster University), to discuss some of the issues raised in Davy's letters.



Peterloo Anniversary 2017: The Peterloo Names

On Wednesday 16th August there was a small ceremony in St Peter's Square when the actor John Henshaw read the list of names and laid a wreath at St Peter's Cross in memory of the dead of the Peterloo massacre of 1819.



On Sunday 20th August people gathered in Albert Square, Manchester to remember the people who took part in the demonstration of 1819. This year the crowd were asked to bring a placard with a name of someone who was there.



Christopher Eccleston, playing the role of magistrate Charles W. Ethelstone, started the commemoration by reading the Riot Act from a window in the Town Hall.

The names of the victims were read out by well-known local figures including the Lord Mayor and the actors John Henshaw and Maxine Peake.

Maxine is currently acting in Mike Leigh's film about Peterloo and she read out a message from the director.







The Peterloo tapestry was displayed and Maxine pinned an extract from the *Masque of Anarchy* with hand-written annotations on how to perform it. Also present was the historian and author Dr Robert Poole who has written a book about the massacre entitled *Return to Peterloo*.



The crowd was also reminded of the campaign for a permanent memorial to the victims before the 200th anniversary in 2019.
